Rotokare is the ancestral home of Ngāti Tupaia, hapū of Tāngahoe and Ngāti Ruanui iwi. Rotokare Scenic Reserve Trust has always worked closely with Ngāti Tupaia and is honoured to receive the status of hau kāinga / people of the land at Rotokare.

Local knowledge is the foundation of Rotokare Reserve and continues to evolve - this narrative is one that is shared within all visits to Rotokare, but digging a little deeper in our history is our new programme...

Aotearoa New Zealand Histories

With this history/social studies programme, we explore Rotokare's human and ecological history and its impact through three epochs—post 1880 with Ngāti Tupaia, the colonial reign with Hāwera Borough Council, and the modern age under the confluence of South Taranaki District Council, Ngāti Tupaia, and Rotokare Trust.

This timeline offers:

- Rotokare's history and importance in the eyes of mana whenua
- The impact of colonialisation on Rotokare and its inhabitants
- The consequences of history on conservation at Rotokare

Content can be adjusted for any age range, from junior primary through to senior high.

Our (almost complete) new outdoors Bush Classroom is an awesome outdoors space of boardwalks and education 'huts' which weave through the beautiful native bush here at Rotokare to further enhance our ever popular year-round education and community engagement programmes.

This fantastic project has been built with the help of many supporters and volunteers so far and we now need YOUR HELP to finish the construction of this wonderful project.

- carrying materials up & down steps & sloped boardwalk
